



# Exploring drivers of vote choice and policy positions among the American electorate.

ANALYSIS OF A 538 / PERRYUNDEM / YOUNG NATIONAL SURVEY

OCTOBER 24, 2022



# Introduction.

In conjunction with 538 and YouGov, PerryUndem conducted a national survey of voters to better understand how various beliefs and ideologies relate to vote choice and specific policy positions.

This report presents results from PerryUndem's analysis of the data.

# The methods.

National survey of likely 2022 voters using YouGov's panel  
Conducted August 10 through August 21, 2022  
Base sample of n = 1,796 voters plus oversamples for totals  
of n = 334 Black voters, n = 327 Latina/o/x voters, and  
n = 336 Asian-American / Pacific-Islander voters

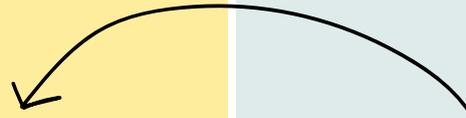

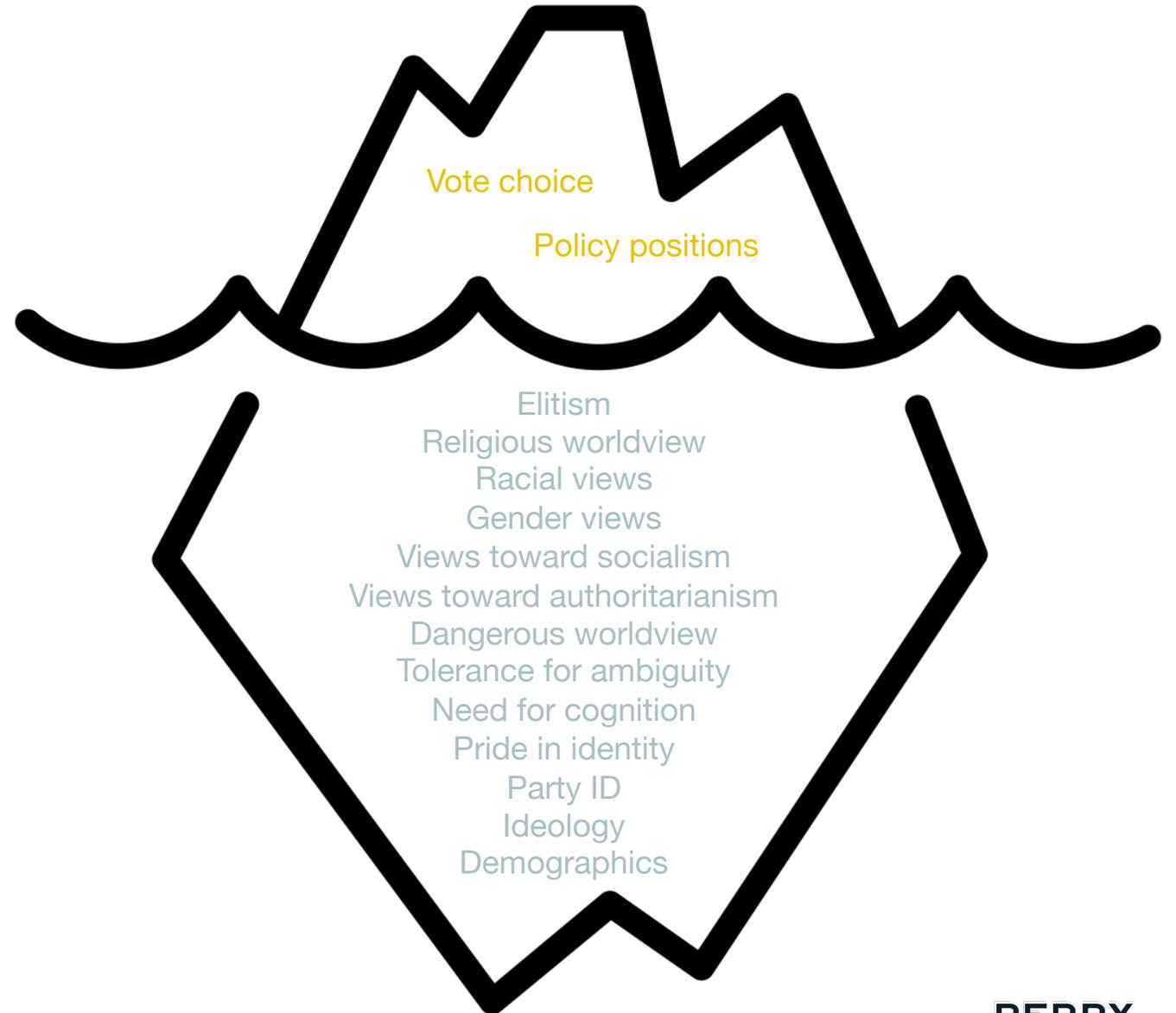

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**We wanted to explore which beliefs, attitudes, and demographics best predict or correlate with vote choice and views toward policy issues.**



**In other words: What might be beneath people's vote choice and policy views?**



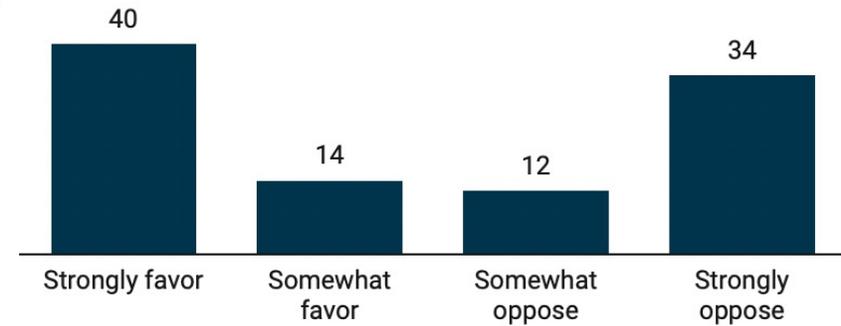


### Views toward building a wall on the U.S.-Mexico border

Do you favor or oppose building a wall along the U.S.-Mexico border?

N = 1,796 likely 2022 voters

While typical polling helps us understand how the public breaks out on various policy issues (see right), we used multivariate regression analysis to uncover the beliefs, attitudes, and demographics that are most correlated with issue positions and vote choice.



For example, regression analysis indicates that a top predictor of how a voter feels about building a wall on the U.S.-Mexico border is the degree to which they agree with this statement: “Today, discrimination against white people has become as big of a problem as discrimination against people of color.”

In other words, we have the best chance of guessing correctly someone’s position on a border wall if we know they feel about discrimination against white people.

Interestingly, this sentiment – “it’s very important to me that people respect rule and order” – is much less predictive of one’s position on a border wall than their views toward race.

## Views toward building a wall on the U.S.-Mexico border

Do you favor or oppose building a wall along the U.S.-Mexico border?

### Top predictors of favoring building a wall along the U.S.-Mexico border

- Agree: Today, discrimination against whites has become as big a problem as discrimination against Blacks, Latinos, or other racial/ethnic minorities (.73 Pearson correlation coefficient\*)
- Disagree: I support the Black Lives Matter movement (.73)
- Agree: America is losing important American traditions like marriage, family, religion, and the flag (.71)
- Party ID (.71)
- Agree: Our country must avoid becoming socialist (.70)
- Agree: White men are the most attacked group in the country right now (.70)

*\* Correlation coefficients are a measure of correlation between two variables, where 1 represents a perfect positive correlation and -1 represents a perfect inverse correlation.*

In addition to analyzing the predictive power of individual views and beliefs, we created five indices that reflect ideologies and worldviews related to:

**Race**  
**Gender**  
**White male dominance**  
**Religion**  
**Elitism**

# Five big takeaways.

**1**  
**In our dataset, racial views are the most powerful attitudinal predictors across vote choice and various policy positions.**

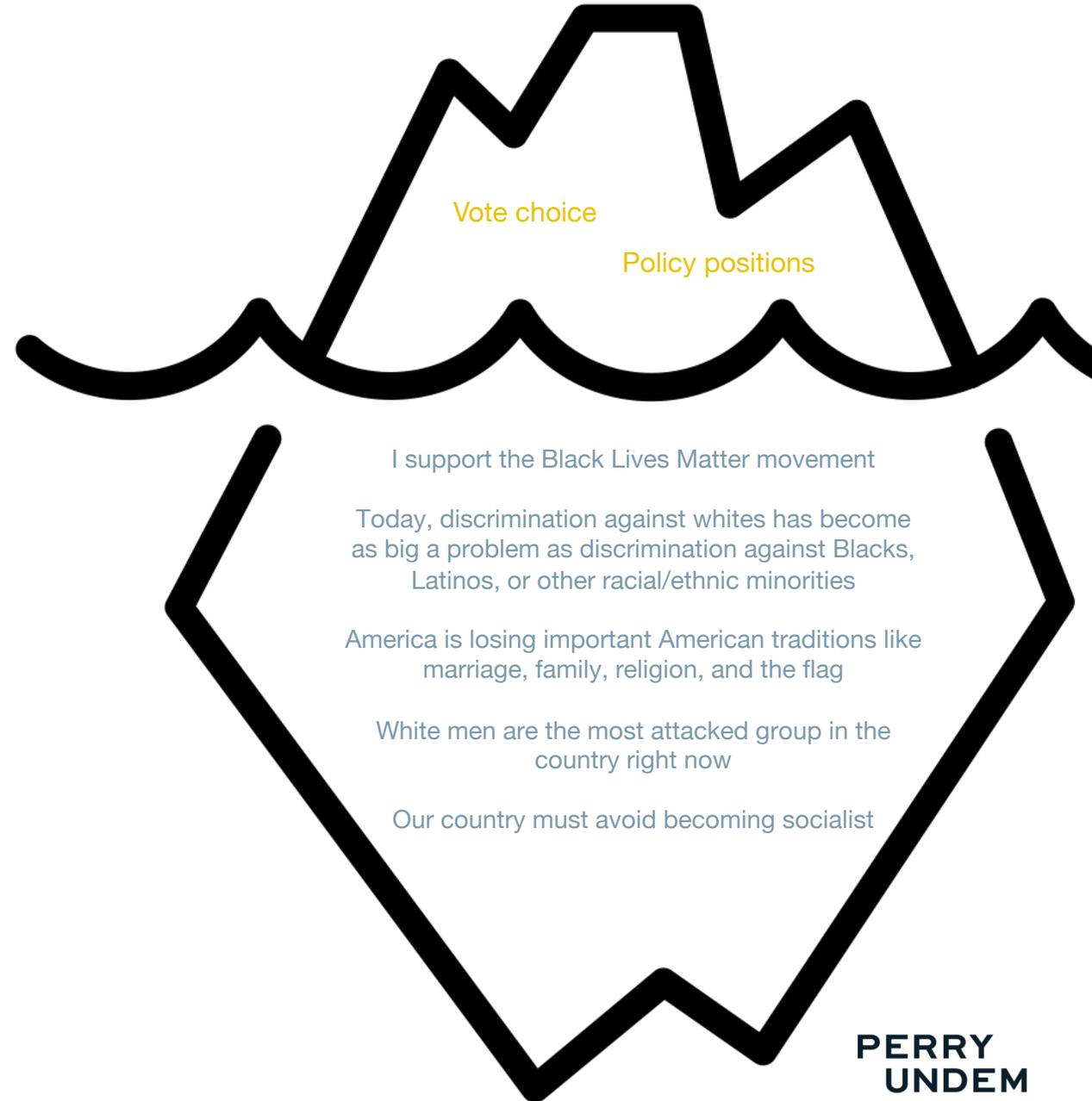
Beliefs related to race are consistently more predictive than views related to religion, elitism, socialism, authoritarianism, pride in one's identity, and more than any demographic variable (aside from 2020 vote and in many cases equal to or more so than party ID).

**2**  
**The single most common predictor of policy positions across several measures** is the level of agreement with this statement: "I support the Black Lives Matter movement."

**3**  
**Views toward the Black Lives Matter movement are just as predictive of 2022 generic ballot vote choice (Democratic or Republican House candidate) as party ID.**

**4**  
**After racial beliefs, views related to gender are among the top attitudinal predictors of vote choice and several policy issues.**

5  
**The most consistent individual-item predictors across many policy positions and vote choice are these five attitudinal measures** – all of which seem to reflect backlash on racial progress, feelings of loss, and tradition or norms juxtaposed with change.



# Detailed findings.

# Predictors of vote choice.

What do we mean by a “predictor”? A predictor is a view / belief / demographic variable in the survey that has a very strong correlation with another variable. For example, how someone voted in the 2020 election is a very strong predictor in our dataset of whether they plan to vote Democratic or Republican in their district’s 2022 House race.

Think of it this way: If you want to guess correctly someone’s intention to vote Democratic or Republican, your best bet (given 100+ variables in our survey) is knowing how they voted in 2022. That’s not surprising, but the other top predictors are much more interesting!

Correlation does not mean causation.

## Which demographics, beliefs, views, and policy positions best predict voting Democratic or Republican in the 2022 U.S. House race?

The first thing we analyzed using regression analysis is which variables in the survey are most correlated with how respondents plan to vote in the midterms (see variables on the next page).

## Here's what we what found.

Support / opposition to the Black Lives Matter movement explains just as much variance in vote choice as party affiliation. Other beliefs related to race and gender are also among the top predictors:

### Top predictors of vote choice (R<sup>2</sup>)\*

- 2020 vote choice (.79)
- Party ID (.65)
- I support the Black Lives Matter movement (.65)
- Favor building a wall along the U.S.-Mexico border (.62)
- Climate change is a big problem in our society today (.55)
- Ideology (conservative / liberal) (.54)
- Abortion views (.50)
- Today, discrimination against whites has become as big a problem as discrimination against Blacks, Latinos, or other racial/ethnic minorities (.50)
- High school students should learn about different gender identities (.49)
- White men are the most attacked group in the country right now (.49)
- Our country must avoid becoming socialist (.48)
- Top concern on voting policy is making sure that every eligible voter who wants to vote can do so (.48)

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\* R<sup>2</sup> is the proportion of the variation in the dependent variable (vote choice) that is predictable from the independent variable (item in the list). A "1" would mean all of the variation in the dependent variable is explained by the independent variable, while "0" means none of the variation is explained.

We also ran regressions using the five indices (see page 10 to 12), along with party ID and 2020 vote. The racial index is just as powerful as party ID. Additionally, the racial and gender indices are better predictors than views toward any policy issue examined in the survey.

**Top predictors of vote choice among indices (R<sup>2</sup>)**

- 2020 vote (Trump/Biden) (.79)
- Racial index (.65)
- Party ID (.65)
- Gender index (.54)
- Political ideology (conservative – liberal) (.54)
- Religious index (.37)
- Elitism index (.37)

## Reading the results.

The following pages provide the strongest predictors of each of 34 policy issues / areas.

Correlation does not mean causation.

Think of it this way: If you want to guess correctly someone's position on given issue, your best bet (given 66 attitudinal and demographic variables in our survey) is knowing where they land on the top predictor(s).

The correlation coefficient is provided for each item. The coefficient is a measure of correlation between two variables, where 1 represents a perfect positive correlation and -1 represents a perfect inverse correlation.

A negative (-) sign next to the coefficient denotes an inverse correlation. For example, on the next slide, age is negatively correlated with the preferred approach to reducing crime. That means the older the respondent, the less likely they are to prefer fully funding schools, etc. as a way to reduce crime (and the more likely they are to prefer a tough on crime approach).

Party ID is coded from Republican to Democrat. Ideology is coded from conservative to liberal.
